



# Senators look into fans' streaming frustration

WASHINGTON - To watch live sports at home in 2025, between all of the apps and channels and streams that games air on thanks to billion-dollar rights deals, it can feel like being in a NASA control room.

Now Congress wants to be involved Now Congress wants to be involved.

On May 6 on Capitol Hill, the Senate
Commerce Committee – which has jurisdiction over the telecommunications
that professional sports leagues use to
broadcast games – interviewed representatives from the NBA, MLB and the
NHL about parts' colverge of stream.

sentatives from the NBA, MLB and the NHL about sports' embrace of streaming, which creates a segmented market that is pricier for consumers.

"This is a growing problem," committee chairman Sen. Ted Cruz, R-Texas, said after the hearing. "Fans are understandably upset that it's really hard to watch your home team, figure out what app or what network, how to watch it. It's fractured right now. It's expensive right now."

Notably, the NFL did not attent une hearing despite Cruz's April I7 letter to Commissioner Roger Goodell requesting his or a league representative's presence. "I wish they had come," Cruz said. "I think the issues that were discussed ap-

think the issues that were discussed ap-ply to them just like they apply to the leagues that were here."

The main lines of questioning during the lightly attended meeting – nine of the 25 committee members showed up the 25 committee members showed up and most stayed for only brief periods – revolved around whether the leagues are not taking advantage of the anti-trust legislation afforded to them through the Sports Broadcasting Act of 1050 The Language widths the same as the stayed of the stay 1961. The leagues said that because they can operate as one entity during media

can operate as one entity during media rights negotiations, they can pool resources to create a cheaper and more accessible model for fans.

John Bergmayer, the fourth witness and the legal director of the nonprofit group Public Knowledge, said fans feel like they finally broke free of the cable bundle only to watch it reform thanks to streaming platforms.

"Streaming is no longer an afterthought, and policymakers, content creators, tech platforms, and sports leagues need to take stens to ensure that

creators, teen planforms, and sports leagues need to take steps to ensure that shifts in the media, technology, and sports landscapes benefit viewers, and lead to cheaper and more convenient options," Bergmayer said during his

up early, with MLB executive vice president of media and business develop-ment Kenny Gersh saying each club has the right to distribute on cable in its market and that 29 of the 30 clubs also have a direct-to-consumer (DTC) option for streamers. But the collapse of the Regional Sports Network (RSN) market

has created an upheaval for leagues.

"As we continue to have flux in the "As we continue to have fux in the system, we're going to have to continue to evaluate," NHL senior executive vice president of media and international strategy David Proper said.

Sen. Marsha Blackburn, R-Tennessee, used her five minutes to grill Koenig about the Daryl Morey "Hong Kong" freedom tweet from nearly six years ago and wanted to know what broadcast rights in China are worth. She also in-quired about internet piracy and its im-pact on streaming.

Sen. Bernie Moreno, R-Ohio, encour-

aged the leagues to find solutions on their own rather than compelling Con-gress to be involved and regulate the leagues further, while Sen. Eric Schmitt, R-Missouri, relied on his experience of trying to stream St. Louis Cardinals games as an example of the plight fans on through to match their teams. go through to watch their teams.

"People do care about this a lot," Schmitt said.

Cantwell was interested in whether the leagues have specific data or metrics about fan complaints.

"It's certainly something we hear,"

Cantwell floated a mandate for teams Cantwell notate a mandate for teams to make their games free in local markets backed by advertising revenue, a more traditional model. She doesn't want the simple act of watching a sporting event to be hijacked by a larger consumer experience like having to buy an annual subscription to a streaming service such as Prime Video or Paeacok. vice such as Prime Video or Peacock.

"There's just too much here where they can just think about the dollar in-stead of thinking about the true con-sumer experience," she said. "In return for the very public benefits

that teams and leagues receive," Berg-mayer said, demonstrating the difference from other entertainment prod-ucts, "there should be an obligation to make sure that games are widely acces-sible."

Cruz said the hearing was meant to be an informational, fact-finding exer-

ties and he was pleased to that end.
A specific remedy, despite multiple legislative avenues, Cruz said, remains up in the air.
"It shouldn't be insanely complicated

or insanely expensive to cheer on your hometown team," he said.

# Swinney insists Clemson 'hasn't changed'

Tigers signed three 'fits' in transfer portal foray

AMELIA ISLAND, FL - We begin with the obvious oddity: In five years of the transfer portal in football, Clemson has

signed five players.

Lane Kiffin signs five in one after-

Noon.
So it should come as no surprise that when asked about his recent wave of portal signings – three in one offseason!
– Clemson coach Dabo Swinney stayed true to a process that has delivered sev-

true to a process that has delivered seven College Football Playoff appearances in the past 10 seasons.
"This is how we go about our business," Swinney said, while attending the ACC spring meetings. "We're just being who we are, and not apologizing for any

But make no mistake, Clemson finally jumped into the transfer portal this offseason. Even if it was in the shallows.

When you go from signing two backwhen you go from signing two back-up quarterbacks (neither was expected to play) early in the evolution of the por-tal, to declaring your locker room is your transfer portal, to signing three players this offseason after a first-round loss in the College Football Playoff, that's no

Or maybe it's just Clemson adjusting in a changing world it has no control

over.

Blue chip defensive end recruit Bryce Davis flipped his commitment to Duke last August, and backup defensive line-man A.J. Hoffler left for ACC rival Georgia Tech after the season. Th wideout Noble Johnson, who left for Ar izona State.

All three were expected to contribute this season, and all three left significant questions. So Swinney signed his first non-quarterback (defensive lineman Will Heldt of Purdue), and the best Foot-ball Championship Subdivision wide

receiver in the portal (Southeast Missouri State's Tristan Smith).

He also added Alabama linebacker Jeremiah Alexander, who Clemson recruited hard in 2022, as a top backup.

So just to recap (and before everyone gets sideways about Clemson's new change in philosophy): Swinney signed a backup linebacker, a No. 3 or 4 receiver, and a starter on the edge in Heldt, who was one of the best defensive play

who was one of the best defensive play-ers in the Big Ten by the end of 2024. That, everyone, was Clemson's big splash in the portal. Its change of phi-

splash in the portal. Its change of phi-losophy.

"We haven't changed anything," Swinney said. "We're still doing the same thing we've always done. Just fol-lowing our purpose."

That's what's so unique about the portal moves that really weren't. They were tactical, and they were purposeful. They were fits.

They were fits.

The danger in the portal era is in oneyear mercenary signings, players who have a year of eligibility remaining or who know they're leaving for the NFL

after the transfer year and aren't invested in the team's philosophy or chemistry. They're interested in money, and

The fallout, if you're not careful, erodes what coaches and players take years to build. There's a locker room dy-namic that already is tenuous, with most players essentially on one-year

deals.

When mercenary signings arrive with big paydays, bad individual fits can soil a team-first locker room and generate a potentially combustible situation – and season. An ecosystem of young egos that already is fragile in the era of transfer portal and free player movement can fill pivith one player.

"They are really committed guys," Swinney said of the three transfers. "They love Clemson, love their teammates and are easy to coach."

mates and are easy to coach.

Don't tell Swinney he has changed his ways, don't tell him he has finally submitted to chaotic roster and team building in the portal era. That he has embraced the portal and all of its flaws

because there's no alternative. He's still the same driven and foundational secure wall he was as a walk-on dational secure wan fee was as wais.-on wide receiver at Alabama in the early 1990s. Doesn't mean he can't or won't change, it just means he believes in a philosophy that has led to double-digit win seasons in 14 of the last 15 years, the only outlier a nine-win season in 2023

So yeah, he knows what he's doing

thank-you.

Like he knew he had to fire defensive coordinator Wes Goodwin, who coached with Swinney in some capacity over the last 13 years and most recently running the defense for the last three

But when the defense couldn't get off but which the defense country get on the field, and left the Clemson offense with little wiggle room in big games, change had to happen. So Swinney hired Tom Allen away

from Penn State to run his defense

Irom Penn State to run his derense.
Allen, of course, fits. He not only is one of the most respected teachers in the game, his unique family-driven personality was the nucleus of his LEO (Love Each Other) mantra at Indiana the foundation of one of the best Hoosiers teams in decades in 2020.

He fits Clemson because Swinney isn't bringing someone into his world that doesn't, or may not.

Just like the three players he signed

Just like the three players he signed from the transfer portal.

They fit with a team that returns 16 starters, and a hot quarterback (Cade Klubnik), and a roster that felt what it was like to play in the CFP for the first time since 2020.

Swinney says he isn't changing, but he sure isn't going to roll into a season with roster deficits from a process he can't control.

can't control.

Especially with a team with so much potential. "We're lifelong learners," Swinney

said. "If you show me somebody who's great at anything, I'll show you a lifelong learner."

Why would anyone apologize for that?

"One of the reasons we like using the tush push is we think it's a safer play than the quarterback sneak. The quarthan the quarterback sheak. The quarterback sheak, if you talk to quarterbacks about it, there's more spearing going on. They're less protected by players around them. And one of the reasons we got motivated to develop an expertise in this play is it was more protective to the quarterback. to the quarterback.
"So, it's ironic that people would

bring up health and safety. We're at the top of the game in terms of wanting health and safety on every play. We vot-ed for hip-drop tackle and a defenseless

receiver.

"We will always, always support what is safer for the players. It's a no-brainer. If this is proven to be less safe for the players, we will be against the tush push.

"But until that's the case, to me, there would be no present to bus this play."

would be no reason to ban this play."

"I would definitely say there are some people that have health and safety conpeople that have health and safety concerns, but there's just as many people that have football concerns," Rich Mc-Kay, CEO of the Atlanta Falcons and cochairman of the NFL's competition committee, has said. "It was much more about the play, the aesthetics of the play. Is it what football has been traditionally or is it more of a rugby play?"

It's not a rugby play?"

It's gorgeous. And when the Eagles star across numerous broadcasts this coming season, we may not see it.
